MOTION TO RESTRICT DISCLOSURE

GEORGE ANTHONY and CINDY ANTHONY, as custodians of the remains of CAYLEE ANTHONY, the Victim in the above referenced case, pursuant to Fl. R. Criminal P. 3.220 (d) (3) (e), moves this Court to restrict disclosure of certain documents and as grounds therefore will show:

1. George Anthony and Cindy Anthony were given custody and control of the remains of Caylee Marie Anthony through a Power of Attorney signed by Caylee Anthony's biological mother.
2. As a necessary part of the investigation into this young child's death, an autopsy was performed on Caylee Anthony's remains.
3. The results and findings of that autopsy are scheduled to be released as part of the State of Florida's Discovery.
4. As custodians of Caylee's remains and her grandparents, George and Cindy Anthony are respectfully asking this Court to restrict the release of the autopsy results. The information contained within the report will cause great anguish to the Anthony family, still struggling with the loss of their only granddaughter.
5. George and Cindy Anthony understand that eventually the autopsy report will be public knowledge and public record because of the trial of Casey Anthony.
6. Releasing the autopsy report to the media at this point in time causes endless comment and speculation in the media and public forums, such as the internet. The publication of these results has already been the topic of countless television programs despite the fact that the actual autopsy

report has not been released.

7. The commentary and speculation about the coroner's findings is so broad that the Anthony family cannot avoid hearing about it despite their effort to do so.


8. The speculation about the cause of death and the condition of Caylee's remains has caused great difficulty for the Anthony's in their grieving.

9. As the eventual release of these findings will be a part of the trial, there is no prejudice in keeping the autopsy report sealed until it is necessary for the State of Florida's case in chief.

10. Out of respect and consideration for the remains of Caylee Marie Anthony as well as her grandparents, George and Cindy Anthony, the autopsy results should be released when necessary to issues that will be adjudicated before the Court.

WHEREFORE, the Custodians of Caylee Marie Anthony's remains respectfully move this Court to enter an Order restricting the State of Florida from disclosing the above referenced autopsy report as part of Discovery in the above referenced case.
