Now, she sent you a text message in Q. reference to the smell of the car; is that correct? 11 12 Α. Yes. 13 Okay. And that was on what date, do you 0. 14 recall? 15 A. I think it's in here somewhere. I don't know 16 what day it was. I can help you if you want to look towards the . 17 Q. 18 date for your statement to confirm it. 19 That would be great. Α. The 27th. June 27th. 20 0. Okay. 21 MR. KIRKCONNELL: June or July? 22 THE WITNESS: It would have been June. 23 MR. BAEZ: June. 24 THE WITNESS: Okay. Yeah, the 27th is when she

confirmed -- like, when she said what it was.

there were definitely a day or two that she had been like, dude, my car smells and I don't know what it is. Just, like, one of those -- I mean, I think everyone's had that time you're like what is that smell. I don't understand. And she just said it smelled, like, you know, something had died in her car and she had no clue what it is. And I think it was -- she -- it was coming from the engine areaish is what she had said. And then when she -- you know, finally it was -- she was letting me know she had found what it was and that it was a squirrel that she figured her dad had run over when he was driving the car.

## BY MR. BAEZ:

- Q. Let me ask you this --
- A. Yes.
- Q. -- do you have any other text messages about the smell or was it just that one text message?
  - A. I don't know. You have the text messages.
- 20 Q. Do you recall any?
  - A. I -- the actual naming of a squirrel, I think that was the only conversation we had about it. I do not know if talking about the smell was in text messages or in a voice conversation.
    - Q. Okay. I noticed you have your statements with

you. Do you recall if you mentioned any other text messages or is this the only text message?

A. Of the --

- Q. Anything regarding the smell of the car?
- A. Like I said, I know we talked about it but I don't know if it was in a text message or in a voice conversation.
- Q. Okay. Do you know if you spoke about it before the 27th or after the 27th?
- A. Before, because the 27th was when she said what it was and there was at least a day, if not two days, that she had told me about the smell.
- Q. And the way you make -- the way you remember that is because she says there was definitely something plastered to the side of --
  - A. Yes.
- Q. Okay. That's what makes you remember that it was before and not after?
- A. Well, her telling me that something was plastered was the confirmation of what we had previously talked about, so we would had previously talked about it.
- Q. Is there anything else that triggers your memory, other than that text message, that it was before that text message and not after?

- A. Well, just that I know that was the confirmation of what had happened and it would have had to happen before.
- Q. I understand. My question is: Is there anything else that triggers your memory other than that text message?
- A. Not that triggers. I just know it happened before.
- Q. Okay. So, no, there's nothing else that maybe you wrote down or --
- A. Nothing. Nothing that I could physically show you, no.
  - Q. Okay. So what actually gets your memory going is that text message?
- A. I suppose.

- Q. Okay. Had you told anyone else about the
- A. Not at that point because it -- I don't -unless it was an amusing anecdote to friends. But it
  didn't matter, everyone runs over an animal from time to
  time. It wasn't a big deal.
- Q. Okay. We were starting to talk about, before you got your calendar, the 16th. Actually, let's start at the 15th, if you can.
  - A. Of June, correct?

- Q. Of June, yes. Do you show or can you recall any conversations you had with Casey on the 15th of June?
- A. Says that I talked to her on the phone about living situation.
  - Q. Okay.

  - Q. Okay. And in all of that you are unable to come up with anything or recall anything that may have seemed out of the ordinary for Casey?
    - A. (Shakes head.)

- Q. You're shaking your head no?
- A. No.

- Q. Okay.
  - A. Not -- not that I can recall me recalling then.
  - Q. Okay.
- A. We were all 100 percent shocked when this happened.
- Q. And as you sit here two-and-a-half, close to three years later, there's still nothing that jogs your memory or helps you recall anything that happened within that month's time frame that would have given you an indication from Casey's actions that something was wrong?
- A. No. Only things looking back that I feel like I should have picked up on. Like, it was weird that Caylee was spending so much time with the nanny, that she -- you know, but there's also times that she said she was with her mom but it just -- Casey had taken all this time off work because she had vacation time, but wasn't with Caylee because she said that was a better circumstance.

Like, looking back on it, you're like, that doesn't seem so normal, but at the time you bought it because she always had so many details readily there that there -- you just sort of went with it because it

made sense.

- Q. So before they announced it to the public that the body was found, they came around to tell people that they had found her?
- A. I -- I think it was after it had come out on the news that a body was found, and I think they came around to just say that they were fairly certain it was actually -- because there were a few times when they thought they had found something. I don't remember the exact timeline. That was a long time ago.
  - Q. Okay. And what did they tell you?
- A. Pretty much that they were fairly certain it was it. They just wanted to see how people were doing

and make sure people were okay and -- to that effect.

It was very pleasant.

Q. Who is "they"?

- A. Detective Edward and Yuri Melich.
- Q. Okay. Did they ask you any more questions about what you remembered at the time?
- A. They may have. I don't recall. I had a -- you know, I had a very nice relationship with them so it wasn't -- I felt very comfortable talking to them about anything.
- Q. And in these two times that you gave statements, obviously -- did you speak to them before you went on tape?
- A. Briefly, I think, but not -- when I first come in for this statement with Corporal Edwards I had given them my phone to get the text messages. They had taken that and there was some meeting going on so I was there in the room by myself for quite some time because there was just something that happened that -- stuff comes up. - A. I'm pretty sure it was in that trip, but not 100. Like I'm 90ish percent sure that it happened on that trip.
  - Q. Okay. And then after that what happened?
- A. I dropped her off at Tony's and then drove back to pick up all the guys, because we weren't all going to fit in the car with our luggage. So I drove back to the airport to pick up the guys and then we drove back to JP's.
  - Q. Okay. And then where did you go?
- A. I went to the Florida Mall with JP in his car because he wanted to go pick up the new iPhone that had come out while we were gone. And the Florida mall is fun to walk around in so I tagged along.
- Q. Tell me about the conversation when Cindy calls you. What happened --
- A. She called me and asked me -- you know, obviously stated who she was and then asked me if I had seen Casey or Caylee. I was, like, well, I just saw Casey like an hour and a half ago, but I haven't seen Casey -- or Caylee in a while. And so she proceeded to tell me that, like, she needed to find her, that she was going to be in really big trouble. I believe she

mentioned jail for some reason. I don't recall what the reasoning was why she was going to be going to jail, but just seemed very important that she find her and that she hadn't seen her in a long time. So that the car — her car had been impounded for two weeks and that she just really needed to find Casey.

- Q. Did she say anything about the smell in the car?
- A. I don't think she said anything about the smell of the car on the phone conversation. She said -- she did later in the car, but not, I don't believe, over the phone.
- Q. Okay. So then she picks you up at the Florida mall?
  - A. Yes.

- Q. You get in the car and then what's the conversation like as you're going to Tony's house?
- A. Well, first it was a, it's nice to finally meet you because I had yet to meet her at that point. And she told me -- like actually then told me then the whole story of the car impound, that was when she had told me about the smell.
  - Q. What did she say in describing the smell?
- A. She said that it smelled -- it was the most horrible smell that she had ever smelled and that they

1 were terrified that it was either Casey or Caylee in the 2 car -- in the trunk until they got it open. But that was -- that was her fear and she was barely controlling, like, emotion in saying that. Like, that was -- you could see that that was still something shat she remembered being upset about that that thought was in her mind.

- Did she say she smelled the car or did she say Q. George smelled the car?
  - Both of them. I believe they were both there. Α.

- Let me ask you this: Why when she called you did you not call Casey and say, hey, your mom's looking for you, call her?
  - I knew someone who had a lot of problems and I gotten pretty close with his mom, and the tone of voice that she would use when she would call me just at her wits end of not doing -- knowing what to do with him, that was the tone of voice that I heard in her. And obviously she had been dodging her mom. I knew she had been dodging her mom. And the fact that she was going to drive all the way out to the Florida mall -- that summer gas was over \$4.00 a gallon. When I told her I

can be there in an hour and a half if I drove myself, she immediately wanted to come get me. It seemed like a really desperate mother who needed someone to help.

Q. Did you sense any loyalty to Casey at that moment?

And I really hope Casey's not mad at me, I hope -- you know, like, I -- I vacillated back and forth if I was actually going to get in that car when she got there with my mom for probably a good 45 minutes.
- Q. Okay. So what else did she say on the way to Tony's house?
- A. Well, she told me about the car and then she asked me if I knew where Casey was working. And I told her that -- what I had thought, that she was working at Universal as an event planner. And she said she didn't even think that Casey had a job.
- Q. Let me stop you there. How did the topic of her job come up?
  - A. I don't remember. I think there was a lot of between us -- like, we each knew the other person had information that the other one wanted. And so there

were a lot of very random questions both from me and from her of just I'm pretty sure you're going to know the answer to this so I'm just going to ask you. I don't remember how that one came up, just that it did.

Q. What other topics came up?

- A. Topics of the -- her stealing money from both Cindy, stealing money from her grandmother through a routing check on a birthday -- or routing number on a birthday check. And that was when I was like I'm missing money, that's probably where that went. And she was like, yeah, and it's gone.

And we figured it'd be best if Cindy went around the corner so Casey couldn't see her -- at least, you know, held back a little bit. I knocked on the door, got Casey out of the apartment so they could talk. So I knocked on the door, they just said come in. So I opened the door and I just kind of motioned her out. She's like, what? I'm like just come out here.

And then so like she was coming out and I motioned Cindy over. And I got kind of caught in the corner for a while and that was really uncomfortable. And it was just a lot of, you know -- because I guess Casey had said she was in Jacksonville that day to her mom and that was her excuse of that day of why she wasn't at home. And so she -- you know, that was the first thing that she accused her of of, you know, so you're in Jacksonville. And then just a lot of, you know, I need to see Caylee.
