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P R O C E E D I N G S

AMY HUIZENGA, called as a witness by the
Defendant, having been first duly sworn, testified as
follows:

THE WITNESS: I do.

MR. BAEZ: Ms. Huizenga, I'm recording as well,
like the court reporter. If we go off record I'll
pause it in front of you so you can see.

THE WITNESS: Okay.

MR. BAEZ: Can you please state your name for
the record?

THE WITNESS: Amy Huizenga.

MR. BAEZ: Do you want to start off?

MR. MASON: No, go ahead. I can.

MR. BAEZ: Yeah, go ahead.

DIRECT EXAMINATION

BY MR. MASON:

Q. Amy, would you spell your last name for the
record? It is tricky.

A. It's H-u-i-z-e-n-g-a.

Q. How old are you, Amy?

A. I'm 26 years old.

Q. It's my understanding you are currently
employed with a cruise --

A. Yes sir.

1 Q. -- ship something?

2 A. Yeah.

3 Q. Which one is that?

4 A. The Norweigan Epic with Norweigan Cruise
5 Lines.

6 Q. And you go out of Miami or Fort Lauderdale?

7 A. We go out of Miami right now.

8 Q. Where do you get to go?

9 A. We go eastern and western Caribbean, we do
10 St. Martin, St. Thomas, Bahamas and Mexico -- two ports
11 in Mexico and one in Honduras.

12 Q. Are you living here or --

13 A. I am living here. I'm on vacation. We work
14 contracts and then you have a short period off and then
15 you go back.

16 MR. KIRKCONNELL: Let me stop you. It will
17 help the court reporter if you wait until the
18 question is completely finished --

19 THE WITNESS: Okay.

20 MR. KIRKCONNELL: -- even if you know the
21 answer because she can only take down one voice at a
22 time.

23 THE WITNESS: Gotcha. Sorry.

24 BY MR. MASON:

25 Q. Just curious, you're living here except for

1 when you're working or you're -- you know, you're on the
2 boat obviously a lot because we've been trying to find
3 you.

4 A. Yeah. This vacation, yes. I can't say what
5 I'll do next vacation. But at the moment, yes.

6 Q. What is your highest level of formal education,
7 Amy?

8 A. I have a bachelor's degree in theater.

9 Q. From where?

10 A. The University of Central Florida.

11 Q. And at your age you haven't had too many jobs,
12 have you, since school?

13 A. A few.

14 Q. What else have you done?

15 A. I've waitressed at a few different restaurants
16 while working in theater to supplement. Not -- theater
17 not paying much.

18 Q. It's my understanding that you know a young
19 lady by the name of Casey Anthony?

20 A. Yes sir.

21 Q. Can you tell us when and how you first met her?

22 A. I first met her apparently at a party at my
23 house right before I left the first time I worked for
24 cruise ships. I don't recall meeting her, it was a big
25 party. I was told she was there and that I did meet

1 her. I don't recall. The first time I recall meeting
2 her was New Year's Eve of 2000 -- going into 2008.

3 MR. MASON: You want to go there?

4 MR. BAEZ: Yeah, let me jump in here for a
5 second.

6 DIRECT EXAMINATION

7 BY MR. BAEZ:

8 Q. Ms. Huizenga, have you ever taken a deposition
9 before?

10 A. I have not.

11 Q. Let me give you a quick rundown of how it
12 works. We ask you questions. You're under oath
13 basically. It's just like you're in a courtroom and the
14 court reporter is taking everything down that you're
15 saying. So as you're nodding your head to me she can't
16 transcribe. So when we ask you a question, try and
17 respond verbally. And sometimes you'll be tempted to
18 say uh-huh or unh-unh. And if I say is that a yes, I'm
19 not trying to be rude, I'm just trying to get you to
20 verbalize that clearly so it comes out for the record.

21 A. Sure.

22 Q. Another reason too is, as your lawyer pointed
23 out, there will be times when I ask you a question and
24 you'll know the answer before I finish. I'll have to
25 finish the question --

1 A. Okay.

2 Q. -- and then you answer.

3 Mr. Mason had started off when you first met
4 Casey and that was at a party?

5 A. Yes.

6 Q. Do you remember what year?

7 A. The -- that would have been 2007, the one that
8 I don't recall. I guess both of them would have been
9 2007.

10 Q. And when did you catch up with Casey again?

11 A. When I got back off the cruise ship for the
12 first time when I worked for a different company.

13 Q. Okay. And that was more or less when?

14 A. That would have been New Year's of 2007 going
15 into 2008.

16 Q. So you really didn't know Casey that well
17 before --

18 A. Before that, no.

19 Q. -- this incident occurred?

20 A. She had gotten close to my group of friends in
21 the duration of the time when I was gone, and so when I
22 came back she was part of our group. So cool.

23 Q. Okay. Did you begin to get closer to Casey?

24 A. Yes sir.

25 MR. KIRKCONNELL: Let him finish completely.

1 THE WITNESS: I'm sorry.

2 BY MR. BAEZ:

3 Q. How close would you say you were?

4 A. I would say by -- by the summertime we were
5 very, very close.

6 Q. Spoke daily?

7 A. Yes.

8 Q. You told each other personal secrets?

9 A. Yes.

10 Q. Would you say she was the person that you
11 confided in the most at that time?

12 A. I don't -- I don't know if the most. She was
13 someone who was very accessible to talk to. I wouldn't
14 say she would have been the first person I would go to
15 if I really had needed advice on something, but we
16 talked a lot so it was just very convenient.

17 Q. Okay. I had forgot to go into this before
18 about your background.

19 Have you ever been arrested before?

20 A. I have not.

21 Q. Okay. Have you ever had any issues with drugs
22 or alcohol?

23 A. (Shakes head.)

24 Q. Nothing?

25 A. (Shakes head.)

1 Q. Never been committed anywhere for a mental
2 health issue?

3 A. No.

4 Q. Okay. Now, let me ask you this: As you
5 started to get closer to her, do you think she was --
6 that you were the person closest to her at the time?

7 A. At the time, yeah, I -- I think -- I mean, I
8 was aware, obviously, we both had other friends from
9 previous times. But at that time and that moment we
10 were really close, if that makes sense.

11 Q. And tell me some of the qualities in Casey that
12 made you draw closer to her as a friend?

13 A. Seemed to have similar -- obviously similar
14 tastes in friends, we just -- we did a lot of the same
15 stuff and we enjoyed the same TV shows, we liked
16 listening to music. It was just someone that I clicked
17 with and that worked. And I don't have a lot of female
18 friends that I click with, so when I find one it's sort
19 of, like, yeah.

20 Q. Did you find her to be a caring person?

21 A. Yes.

22 Q. Were there times where you needed her for
23 emotional support and she was there for you?

24 A. Yes.

25 Q. Were there times where you were there for her

1 for emotional support?

2 A. Yes.

3 Q. Okay. Were there times when you counted on her
4 and she was there for you?

5 A. There were, and there were times when she let
6 me down when I needed her.

7 Q. Okay. And give me some examples of the times
8 that she was there for you?

9 A. Conversations if I was upset about a boy or
10 just, you know, had a bad day, you know, sending her
11 texts and, you know, getting a reassuring response.
12 Things -- things to that nature. Just, you know,
13 needing someone to talk to and having that person --
14 that friend there to be like it will all be okay.

15 Q. Okay. By June 16th of 2008 you two were fairly
16 close as you had just described?

17 A. Yes.

18 Q. Do you recall anything in particular about that
19 day?

20 A. June 16th, no. I wish I had that thing that we
21 put together. We put together that calendar.

22 Q. The day after Father's Day of -- or Father's
23 Day 2008, let's start there.

24 MS. BURDICK: Are you talking about the
25 calendar you provided to law enforcement at some

1 point?

2 THE WITNESS: Yes.

3 MR. KIRKCONNELL: Do you have that?

4 THE WITNESS: We had -- there was a whole bunch
5 of us that had sat down and put together --

6 MS. BURDICK: Right.

7 MR. BAEZ: I don't have it. I have it but I
8 don't have it with me.

9 MS. BURDICK: Right. I don't think it's in
10 here but we might be able to get it.

11 THE WITNESS: I spent a long time putting that
12 together.

13 BY MR. BAEZ:

14 Q. Would that help you remember --

15 A. Yeah, definitely. I mean, it would be the best
16 way of hoping I can remember.

17 MR. BAEZ: Okay. Let's take a quick break.
18 I'm going to go off the record and pause my
19 recorder.

20 (Short recess.)

21 MR. BAEZ: We're back on the record.

22 BY MR. BAEZ:

23 Q. Actually, let me try and go back a little bit
24 before that date and see if maybe there's some things
25 you might remember.

1 There was a time shortly before the summer
2 where you got into a car accident?

3 A. Yes sir.

4 Q. What happened there?

5 A. I fell asleep on the way home. I lived in
6 Oviedo at the time and there was a very long stretch of
7 not a lot of lights and it was 3:00 in the morning. And
8 I nodded off there before and this time just hit a
9 guardrail.

10 Q. And was the car totaled?

11 A. I told myself it was totaled. It was not. It
12 was going to cost a lot of money to fix, so I just
13 decided to scrap it and get another car.

14 Q. And when did that occur?

15 A. That occurred the beginning -- we just saw it.
16 I want to say the 12th of June -- the 13th of June is
17 when I was going to Jacksonville to buy it and it was
18 the week before that because I had a week without a car.
19 I don't know the exact date that I crashed it. Actually
20 it might be on the calendar, oddly enough. But I know
21 it was aboutish a week before -- wait, the 13th I was
22 supposed to go to Jacks -- I was going to Jacksonville.
23 So it would have been the weekish before the 13th.

24 Q. So the 7th or the 8th?

25 A. Probably.

1 Q. Okay. And you were going to Jacksonville to
2 buy a new car?

3 A. From my uncle.

4 Q. Got it. So you already knew what car you were
5 buying, you were just going up there?

6 A. Yeah, I just had to go pick it up.

7 Q. Anything about Casey's behavior stand out to
8 you during that time period?

9 A. Nothing that seemed unusual. That was the
10 start of us, you know, talking about living together and
11 the start of all the excuses of why this was happening
12 and that was happening. All the various things that
13 came up that I tried to buy and started sounding fishy
14 after a while, but I didn't really want to call her out
15 on it. This was really the first thing that happened
16 that was -- you know, like, I needed her and needed her
17 to take me up there, she had promised she was going to
18 take me there. And then I thought her dad was in the
19 hospital so of course not a big deal, I will make other
20 arrangements, take care of the family. It wasn't true
21 but --

22 Q. Did you find out what was going on in her life
23 that precluded her from going to Jacksonville with you?

24 A. I -- the only reason I even knew that it wasn't
25 true is when I talked to her mom on the 15th of July.

1 Q. So subsequent to that you still don't know what
2 it was that precluded her from being able to help you
3 that day?

4 A. I do not know, no.

5 Q. You don't know if it was just an excuse that
6 she didn't want to go versus something that she was
7 dealing with --

8 A. I could not tell you. I have not had a
9 conversation.

10 Q. Let me finish for her.

11 A. I'm sorry.

12 Q. So you don't know whether it was just a reason
13 where she blew you off versus some reason that was
14 highly personal and she just didn't want to share it
15 with you?

16 A. I couldn't tell you.

17 Q. Okay. Now, at that time you mentioned you had
18 never seen or observed anything -- any change in her
19 behavior, correct?

20 A. The only change that I would note -- and it
21 wasn't really at that point yet, it was later more
22 towards the end of June, beginning of July. That period
23 that she just started partying more. I -- I wouldn't
24 say -- personality-wise, no. Just that she had never
25 really seemed like a really big partier. Like, she

1 would go out, but not, you know, extensive amounts. And
2 then it just -- it seemed like between what she would
3 tell me about on the phone and what I witnessed, that
4 she was just going out more and drinking more when she
5 did go out and it just -- everything became more but --

6 Q. Now, these times that she was going out, did
7 you go out with her?

8 A. Sometimes. More towards once we got into July
9 we were going -- because there was a -- I want to say
10 like a three week period when she first started dating
11 Tony that I didn't see her from -- I think about when we
12 were supposed to go to Jacksonville I'm pretty sure is
13 when I started not seeing her until she showed up at my
14 door, I think, July 1st. There was a while that I just
15 -- I talked to her on the phone and we texted a lot but
16 I hadn't seen her for that whole period of time.

17 Q. So from June 7th through July 1st you really
18 didn't see her?

19 A. It was probably -- it was after my car crash
20 that I had seen her because I remember in there it says
21 that I had banged my nose up in the accident and I
22 remember making fun of me for it. So it was definitely
23 after the accident that I saw her but before
24 Jacksonville.

25 Q. So would a fair statement be approximately June

1 10th?

2 A. I believe so. I think we said on here the 9th
3 was the last time that I think I saw them. I'm pretty
4 sure.

5 Q. So I was pretty close?

6 A. Yeah.

7 Q. Okay. June 9th to July 1st you didn't really
8 see her?

9 A. Yeah.

10 Q. So obviously you didn't go out and party with
11 her during those times?

12 A. No. Only what she told me over the phone.

13 Q. And you didn't observe her drinking or doing
14 anything during this time?

15 A. (Nods head.)

16 Q. Is that a yes?

17 A. I did not see anything.

18 Q. Okay. Prior to June 9th did she go out a lot
19 with you?

20 A. From time to time. And a lot of times it would
21 be us over at JP and Ricardo's. And Caylee would be
22 there, she'd put Caylee to bed. So it wasn't so much
23 going out as all staying in and drinking and having a
24 poker night or playing video games or whatever we
25 happened to be doing that night.

1 Q. So you didn't observe her drinking a lot or
2 partying a lot during that time?

3 A. Not a lot. I mean, we would definitely have,
4 you know, beer, but it wouldn't be like getting wasted.

5 Q. Okay. Was Casey a good mother?

6 A. I thought so.

7 Q. Okay. And what kind of interaction would you
8 see with her and Caylee?

9 A. Very loving, normal relationship. Nothing ever
10 seemed abnormal. She took care of her. She -- Caylee
11 was very well behaved, which obviously bodes something
12 for her parenting because bad parents don't have
13 well-behaved children. That's just the truth. I -- you
14 know, I never saw her get out of hand with Caylee or fly
15 off the handle.

16 There'd be times when, you know, she would kind
17 of be, you know, playing and Casey'd be like, no, you
18 need to stop that when it wasn't anything that was
19 bothering anyone, but that's -- you know, that's her
20 choice as a parent to be like that's not the behavior I
21 want.

22 Q. Did you ever see Casey strike Caylee?

23 A. No.

24 Q. Did you ever see Caylee go without food or --

25 A. No, she always had snacks for her.

1 Q. Okay. What about just completely neglect her
2 and allow her to do dangerous things, I guess?

3 A. Never.

4 Q. Okay. Now, you mentioned you didn't see her
5 from July 1st. Up until July 1st -- and that's when you
6 started to see her again?

7 A. Uh-huh. It's, I'm pretty sure, in here.
8 She -- I was at that point sleeping on a couch at JP and
9 Ricardo's and I was asleep one morning and there was a
10 knock -- or got a phone call and she's like come open
11 the door. Are you outside of it? She was like, yeah.
12 I was like, okay, well, good morning. I worked late at
13 night. So I came and let her in and she was pretty much
14 with me for the majority of the following week.

15 Q. Now, when did you go to Puerto Rico?

16 A. I know I got back on the 15th. We were there
17 for like a week. I don't know if it says on here when
18 we left. It might.

19 THE WITNESS: That will definitely say it.

20 MS. BURDICK: We'll attach that to the
21 deposition at the end. (Inaudible) since we'll
22 refer to it?

23 MR. BAEZ: Sure.

24 MR. ASHTON: That's an extra copy?

25 MS. BURDICK: Yes, that was faxed over.

1 THE WITNESS: I left on the 8th. We all left
2 at different times, but I left on the 8th to go.

3 MR. BAEZ: Let's go ahead and mark that as
4 Exhibit 1 so that way when we refer to it we can be
5 clear for the record.

6 (Exhibit No. 1 was marked for identification.)

7 MS. BURDICK: There's several pages there. You
8 might want to number them so we keep them in the
9 right order.

10 MR. BAEZ: Sure.

11 MS. BURDICK: Because it looks like they're --

12 MR. BAEZ: Amy, let's do this: Start off with
13 the farthest date and then just label Page 1, 2, 3,
14 4, 5, 6.

15 BY MR. BAEZ:

16 Q. Okay. So July 1st, you saw her again July
17 8th --

18 A. I switched those two. Can I see that pen
19 again?

20 Q. Sure.

21 A. There you go.

22 Q. All right. So July 1st she shows up at your
23 door and July 8th you're off to Puerto Rico, correct?

24 A. Yes.

25 Q. So from the 2nd to the 7th --

1 A. No, the 30th is when she showed up.

2 Q. Okay. The 30th. So from the 30th through the
3 7th, basically one week you hung out with her more?

4 A. Yes, extensively.

5 Q. Okay. Now, during this time how many times did
6 you go partying with her?

7 A. I can't read all of this. It -- I wouldn't say
8 it was every night, but it was more often than not that
9 we went out that week or stayed in and hung out there.

10 Q. Okay. The 30th is on what day?

11 A. A Monday.

12 Q. Okay. So did you go out Monday night?

13 And let me stop you there. If you don't know
14 something it's okay to say I don't know.

15 A. Yeah, I don't know.

16 Q. All right.

17 A. It's not on here and I don't think we talked
18 about it in the -- in the statement so I'm not sure.

19 Q. Okay. So can you tell me by looking at
20 something that was written a lot closer in time, how
21 many times you guys went out to party during that week?
22 And if you can't, it's okay.

23 A. Yeah. Some of it's just really hard to read.
24 I think some of it's in the -- there's so many papers.
25 I know we went to a party on the 4th of July, that's

1 definitely for sure.

2 Q. Was that a BBQ or a party?

3 A. A BBQ party. It was -- we did BBQ but we
4 partied as well.

5 Q. Got it. Okay.

6 A. It was like an all day --

7 Q. And what time did you get there?

8 A. I was co-hosting it and since Casey was staying
9 with me we both went early to decorate. It would have
10 been early to midmorning.

11 Q. How long --

12 A. Probably like 11:00ish.

13 Q. -- did this party last?

14 A. Well into the night. I mean, we walked down to
15 Lake Eola for fireworks and then walked back. Maybe
16 10:00, 11:00ish. I know -- somewhere around there. I'm
17 not 100 percent but it would have been later. It was
18 definitely after the fireworks that we went back there.

19 Q. Did she get drunk that night?

20 A. I know she was drinking. I'm -- she was hard
21 to tell. Like, I'm the same way where she held her
22 liquor really well. So, like, if I'm drunk no one knows
23 that I am. I don't prefer to get that way, but at least
24 no one knows that I am. I don't like doing that but it
25 happens.

1 Q. You don't get stumbling drunk or anything
2 like --

3 A. No. No. And she was the same way, so she
4 could have been drunk without exhibiting drunkenness.

5 Q. So if I understand your statement correctly,
6 and correct me if I'm wrong, so she could have one beer
7 or ten beers and you wouldn't be able to tell the
8 difference?

9 A. Yeah.

10 Q. Okay. And same with you?

11 A. Yup. Well, I don't think I could drink ten
12 beers and still be standing but --

13 Q. All right. Okay. Now, did you notice anything
14 else during that week that you spent with her? Any
15 other behavior?

16 A. No, just --

17 Q. Regular?

18 A. It was weird that she was around so much
19 because I was -- I was staying on a couch and she was
20 there all the time. Like, it wasn't my place and I --
21 she was pretty much there. Other than when I was at
22 work she was there.

23 Q. Okay.

24 A. Which I -- struck me as a little bit odd but
25 her boyfriend was out of town, she didn't want to go

1 home. So it sort of made sense even though it was a
2 little weird.

3 Q. Okay. Why did she tell you she didn't want to
4 go home?

5 A. She had said that there -- her parents were
6 just fighting and that they -- at this point I believe
7 she had told me that they were getting a divorce and
8 just -- it was a not happy home situation, which is why
9 she said that she had Caylee with the nanny. And she
10 was pretty much staying with Tony and since Tony was on
11 spring break he was -- or whatever their Full Sail break
12 is, he was -- she was with me.

13 Q. Did she tell you what her plans were for the
14 future?

15 A. She was planning on getting an apartment or a
16 house or something to that eff -- like, finding a place
17 and I was going to be going to live with them. That was
18 one of the reasons why I was still on the couch at that
19 point because I had every intention of moving in with
20 them.

21 Q. Okay. And did you guys go and look at places
22 together?

23 A. We had talked about it. There were a few
24 places where she had said she was going to look at it
25 and she was just going to call me about the time and

1 something would come up. Or there was a point where she
2 had said her mom was going to be signing her house over
3 to her, she was going to take over the mortgage payments
4 and we were just going to move in there, which would be
5 great because Caylee wouldn't have to move and all this
6 stuff. And so that was -- that one lasted the longest.
7 And then, you know, we were going to talk about like
8 me -- there was a time when I was actually going to move
9 in. Like, I had talked to people about helping me get
10 my stuff out of storage. Like, this was happening. And
11 then, you know, her dad was doing landscaping or there
12 was one time that it was something to do with, like, the
13 air conditioning or some pipes or something huge and
14 she's like there's 20 people over at the house, I don't
15 even know what's going on. And that was several excuses
16 in. At that point actually and I remember talking to
17 Ricard and I was like, dude, let's just go drive by
18 because I don't think any of this is happening. I was
19 like let's just do it. She hasn't seen my new car yet,
20 like, let's just drive by, she'll never know it
21 happened. And he wouldn't do it. Which would have
22 actually been great had we done that but --

23 Q. Okay. Now, you say they're excuses and how do
24 you know they're excuses?

25 A. I know they're excuses through the conversation

1 with Cindy Anthony when I asked her if that was ever
2 going to happen and she was like that was never even a
3 thought in my mind.

4 Q. Okay. So because Cindy has told you these
5 things weren't true that's why you believe they're not
6 true?

7 A. They also seemed really farfetched after a
8 while. Like, I was already not as willing to believe.
9 I didn't want to accuse my friend of lying, but I was
10 having a really hard time swallowing that really all of
11 these things were actually happening.

12 Q. But as far as confirmation, the only
13 confirmation you had was Cindy?

14 A. Correct.

15 Q. Okay. Now, had she told you previously that
16 she was having problems with her family?

17 A. Yes.

18 Q. How soon? How far back did she ever share with
19 you that she was having problems with her family?

20 A. They were never good from what I had gathered.
21 Then they seemed to escalate in the June, July period of
22 just normal, you know, family problems to, you know, her
23 mom telling her that she wasn't a good mother. And, you
24 know, which was a shock to me because I had not met
25 her -- any of her family at this point.

1 Q. What kind of problems did she mention
2 previously?

3 A. Mostly just relationship, not getting along.

4 Q. With who?

5 A. With her mother mostly. Really just her
6 mother.

7 Q. Okay. And did these appear to be minor in
8 nature or did she ever say something drastic and serious
9 that made you raise a eyebrow?

10 A. Nothing drastic or serious. I mean, it -- it
11 seemed important to her and it was stuff that -- family
12 relationships are always so weird. But, you know, she
13 was very upset at times at things that were happening
14 which made them seem, regardless of what they were, very
15 important to her, which they could have had more weight
16 than I was aware of because of her past things she -- it
17 seemed like her upsetment (sic) with things got heavier
18 and heavier.

19 Q. Did she appear to be very close to her family?

20 A. That was weird. She would talk about how she
21 was but then things would happen and they'd be -- she'd
22 be upset and mad and then it wouldn't -- like, it seemed
23 like she just never got along with them. It seemed very
24 back and forth from what she would say.

25 Q. Would you describe them as extremes? Like, she

1 was really close and then she really wasn't very close?

2 A. Yeah. But it would be stories that she would
3 tell about closeness. I couldn't tell you anything
4 specifically. But, like, things she would talk about it
5 would seem like, you know, there was this good
6 relationship and then it was this bad relationship.

7 Q. What was her relationship with, like, Lee from
8 what you knew?

9 A. Close.

10 Q. How do you know this?

11 A. I believe she said my brother and I are very
12 close. I -- I can't remember any specific stories, but
13 I know she felt very close with him and his
14 girlfriend -- whose name I don't recall. But she -- you
15 know, she definitely talked about going to hang out with
16 them and just -- she really liked that aspect of her
17 family a lot.

18 Q. Okay. What about her father? Was she close
19 with her father?

20 A. I don't really remember her talking about her
21 dad a huge munt -- amount. I'm sure she did but I
22 don't -- nothing sticks out in my mind as -- I don't
23 think she had a bad relationship with him, but I don't
24 think it was something she -- a lot of stuff centered
25 around her mom.

1 Q. Did she ever share with you any allegations in
2 reference to possible abuse that she may have --

3 A. No.

4 Q. Okay. Neither physical abuse or sexual abuse?

5 A. Nope.

6 Q. Nor emotional?

7 A. Not that I can recall. I feel like I would
8 remember that.

9 Q. Okay. But you obviously heard.

10 A. Yes, I've heard stuff.

11 Q. -- through media outlets these stories?

12 A. Yeah.

13 Q. Okay. Now, on the 30th when she came knocking
14 on your door, did she mention that she needed to get a
15 gas can?

16 A. Yes.

17 Q. Did you know about that beforehand or --

18 A. Yes.

19 Q. Okay. When?

20 A. She had twice run out -- no, the other was a
21 flat tire. She had told me twice about running out of
22 gas. One time it happened and I think -- I want to say
23 Tony brought her gas. I'm not 100 percent. I know it
24 happened one time previously and this was another time
25 that she had ran out of gas and she was, you know,

1 wanting to know if I had a gas can. And I was like, no,
2 but you can just go to Target. I was like I don't know
3 what I have in storage, I may or may not have one there.
4 So you can always use a gas can so let's go get it, you
5 can use it and then just bring it back to me. So we did
6 that that day.

7 Q. Okay. And that was the 30th?

8 A. Yes.

9 Q. Okay. And why did she tell you she needed a
10 gas can?

11 A. She had run out of gas.

12 Q. Okay. Did she say her car was at the Amscot or
13 did she say --

14 A. The Amscot.

15 Q. -- you know, I want to have this for future
16 reference?

17 A. Yeah, it was the Amscot. Because when she got
18 back there she told me it had been towed.

19 Q. Okay. Did she ever mention that her car was in
20 the shop or that her father was going to pick up the car
21 or anything like that?

22 A. Yes, I believe -- I don't know if it's on here
23 at all. If I recall correctly, she had -- like, it had
24 gotten towed and her dad had gotten it out of impound
25 and had took it into -- taken it to the shop I think to

1 fix whatever the -- like, I don't know if it was a gas
2 gauge problem that she said it had. Like, there was
3 something going on.

4 Q. Yeah, because I've read your statements and I
5 was trying -- and I did recall you making that
6 statement, something about her dad picking up the car.
7 I wasn't sure if she had picked it up before it had ran
8 out of gas and taken it to the shop or --

9 A. No. I do -- I definitely remember her
10 saying -- like, getting there and being like, guess
11 what?

12 Q. Okay. So she said, guess what, my car was
13 towed?

14 A. Yeah.

15 Q. And later on she told you that her dad was made
16 aware of it and that he was getting it out of the
17 impound lot?

18 A. Uh-huh.

19 Q. Is that a yes?

20 A. Yes. Yes. Sorry.

21 Q. And he was taking it to the shop?

22 A. Yes.

23 Q. Okay. Did she say she was going to get a new
24 car or anything like that?

25 A. She had -- I remember her having a lot of

1 problems -- like, her talking about a lot of problems
2 with the car. There were a couple things in here
3 that -- or actually I think it was one of the few text
4 messages I was able to read, of just, you know, having
5 to replace certain things and having had spent a lot of
6 money on the car. And she had talked a lot about
7 getting a new car, but not actually get -- like she
8 wanted to get another one, but it wasn't something that
9 she wasn't going for -- doing at the time.

10 Q. Okay. Now, she sent you a text message in
11 reference to the smell of the car; is that correct?

12 A. Yes.

13 Q. Okay. And that was on what date, do you
14 recall?

15 A. I think it's in here somewhere. I don't know
16 what day it was.

17 Q. I can help you if you want to look towards the
18 date for your statement to confirm it.

19 A. That would be great.

20 Q. Okay. The 27th. June 27th.

21 MR. KIRKCONNELL: June or July?

22 THE WITNESS: It would have been June.

23 MR. BAEZ: June.

24 THE WITNESS: Okay. Yeah, the 27th is when she
25 confirmed -- like, when she said what it was. But

1 there were definitely a day or two that she had been
2 like, dude, my car smells and I don't know what it
3 is. Just, like, one of those -- I mean, I think
4 everyone's had that time you're like what is that
5 smell. I don't understand. And she just said it
6 smelled, like, you know, something had died in her
7 car and she had no clue what it is. And I think it
8 was -- she -- it was coming from the engine areaish
9 is what she had said. And then when she -- you
10 know, finally it was -- she was letting me know she
11 had found what it was and that it was a squirrel
12 that she figured her dad had run over when he was
13 driving the car.

14 BY MR. BAEZ:

15 Q. Let me ask you this --

16 A. Yes.

17 Q. -- do you have any other text messages about
18 the smell or was it just that one text message?

19 A. I don't know. You have the text messages.

20 Q. Do you recall any?

21 A. I -- the actual naming of a squirrel, I think
22 that was the only conversation we had about it. I do
23 not know if talking about the smell was in text messages
24 or in a voice conversation.

25 Q. Okay. I noticed you have your statements with

1 you. Do you recall if you mentioned any other text
2 messages or is this the only text message?

3 A. Of the --

4 Q. Anything regarding the smell of the car?

5 A. Like I said, I know we talked about it but I
6 don't know if it was in a text message or in a voice
7 conversation.

8 Q. Okay. Do you know if you spoke about it before
9 the 27th or after the 27th?

10 A. Before, because the 27th was when she said what
11 it was and there was at least a day, if not two days,
12 that she had told me about the smell.

13 Q. And the way you make -- the way you remember
14 that is because she says there was definitely something
15 plastered to the side of --

16 A. Yes.

17 Q. Okay. That's what makes you remember that it
18 was before and not after?

19 A. Well, her telling me that something was
20 plastered was the confirmation of what we had previously
21 talked about, so we would had previously talked about
22 it.

23 Q. Is there anything else that triggers your
24 memory, other than that text message, that it was before
25 that text message and not after?

1 A. Well, just that I know that was the
2 confirmation of what had happened and it would have had
3 to happen before.

4 Q. I understand. My question is: Is there
5 anything else that triggers your memory other than that
6 text message?

7 A. Not that triggers. I just know it happened
8 before.

9 Q. Okay. So, no, there's nothing else that maybe
10 you wrote down or --

11 A. Nothing. Nothing that I could physically show
12 you, no.

13 Q. Okay. So what actually gets your memory going
14 is that text message?

15 A. I suppose.

16 Q. Okay. Had you told anyone else about the
17 smell --

18 A. Not at that point because it -- I don't --
19 unless it was an amusing anecdote to friends. But it
20 didn't matter, everyone runs over an animal from time to
21 time. It wasn't a big deal.

22 Q. Okay. We were starting to talk about, before
23 you got your calendar, the 16th. Actually, let's start
24 at the 15th, if you can.

25 A. Of June, correct?

1 Q. Of June, yes. Do you show or can you recall
2 any conversations you had with Casey on the 15th of
3 June?

4 A. Says that I talked to her on the phone about
5 living situation.

6 Q. Okay.

7 A. Which was a fairly common conversation at that
8 time of life.

9 Q. Is there anything that stands out from that
10 conversation?

11 A. No.

12 Q. Okay.

13 A. Not that I recall. A lot of our conversations
14 would be just chatting, you know, a lot about -- you
15 know, figuring out what we were going to do, talking
16 about, you know, living together.

17 Q. Got it. Okay. What about the 16th, do you
18 show having any conversations with her then?

19 A. No. That notation is about Jesse.

20 Q. Okay. Do you recall any conversations you had
21 with her on the 16th?

22 A. I could have. I -- if -- I'm sure my phone
23 records would show if we did or not, but all the
24 conversations in that period of time were very much so
25 us talking about, you know, living stuff or the things

1 that she would tell me why things weren't working out
2 and then just life, friends talking.

3 Q. Gotcha. So nothing from the -- if you spoke
4 with her on that day there's nothing that stands out
5 from that --

6 A. I --

7 Q. Let me finish for her. If you spoke to her
8 that day there's nothing that stands out from those
9 conversations that seem out of the ordinary?

10 A. No.

11 Q. Okay. And around that time period you would
12 have been talking about moving in together?

13 A. Yes.

14 Q. Okay. What about the 17th?

15 A. We have nothing notated on that day.

16 Q. Okay. And the 18th?

17 A. I don't think I have anything here either.
18 This is -- this is kind of during the time period where
19 she -- I didn't see her at all and was -- you know, when
20 we did talk it would either be on the phone or text
21 messages. So, as I previously stated, it was all kind
22 of the same types of conversations.

23 Q. And if you had a conversation with her on the
24 18th, there's nothing that stands out from that day that
25 makes that day sound out of the ordinary?

1 A. No.

2 Q. And the 19th?

3 A. I don't remember any conversations in that time
4 period that were out of the ordinary. Like, I -- we all
5 spent a lot of time wracking our brains when all this
6 was happening, trying to think of any little detail that
7 we could possibly -- I mean, we talked for hours trying
8 to spark each other's memories of things that could
9 possibly help because at the time we were sincerely
10 hoping Caylee was alive and we wanted to do everything
11 we could to help. I don't --

12 Q. So you had spent significant -- let me see if I
13 can clear it up so I don't have to take a day.

14 A. Yeah.

15 Q. So from July 16th when Casey got arrested you
16 had spent significant time with other mutual friends and
17 law enforcement trying to determine if there was any
18 conversations or reactions or anything from Casey that
19 would have given you an indication that there was
20 something wrong?

21 A. Yes.

22 Q. Okay. And in all of that you are unable to
23 come up with anything or recall anything that may have
24 seemed out of the ordinary for Casey?

25 A. (Shakes head.)

1 Q. You're shaking your head no?

2 A. No.

3 Q. Okay.

4 A. Not -- not that I can recall me recalling then.

5 Q. Okay.

6 A. We were all 100 percent shocked when this
7 happened.

8 Q. And as you sit here two-and-a-half, close to
9 three years later, there's still nothing that jogs your
10 memory or helps you recall anything that happened within
11 that month's time frame that would have given you an
12 indication from Casey's actions that something was
13 wrong?

14 A. No. Only things looking back that I feel like
15 I should have picked up on. Like, it was weird that
16 Caylee was spending so much time with the nanny, that
17 she -- you know, but there's also times that she said
18 she was with her mom but it just -- Casey had taken all
19 this time off work because she had vacation time, but
20 wasn't with Caylee because she said that was a better
21 circumstance.

22 Like, looking back on it, you're like, that
23 doesn't seem so normal, but at the time you bought it
24 because she always had so many details readily there
25 that there -- you just sort of went with it because it

1 made sense.

2 Q. So other than her availability and Caylee's
3 unavailability, there's nothing else that stands out?

4 A. No. Except for I guess the -- her starting to
5 party more in this period of time -- or her verbally
6 telling me that she was.

7 Q. Okay. Now, did you come to find out that Tony
8 was a DJ at a nightclub?

9 A. I knew he DJ's. I feel like I knew he did
10 sometimes at -- was it Fusion that they would go to?
11 Whatever that place is, that they would go to. I knew he
12 promoted there, I wasn't -- I'm not entirely sure his
13 involvement. I know he was a DJ, I just wasn't entirely
14 sure where he was employed.

15 Q. You also understood that he promoted the club?

16 A. Yes.

17 Q. And did you come to understand that Casey was
18 also assisting him in promoting it?

19 A. Yes.

20 Q. And part of promoting a club would be to tell
21 people, hey, come out to this place, it's ladies night?

22 A. Yes.

23 Q. Or the drinks are half off or something like
24 that?

25 A. Yes.

1 Q. And it's a great place?

2 A. Yes.

3 Q. And we were there last week and we had a great
4 time.

5 A. Yes.

6 Q. Okay. Did that seem -- did Casey do those
7 things?

8 A. Not so much. Like, she would ask me to come
9 but it would be like, dude, you should come with us
10 tonight. Not so much, like, oh, this is a great place
11 that you should go to. It was a --

12 Q. So it was more personal with you?

13 A. Yes. I -- I understood that she was doing that
14 but I never witnessed it.

15 Q. Okay. Did you hear of her going out partying
16 at other places other than Fusion? And I'm talking
17 specifically about that month period of time.

18 A. Uh-huh. I don't think so. I -- I know they
19 hung out at Tony's a lot, like, you know, partying
20 there. Like, I -- that seems like such a weird word
21 because it wasn't like a party but, like, hanging out
22 and drinking there.

23 Q. Okay. So other than being at Tony's house and
24 at Fusion, you don't have any recollection of her going
25 anywhere else?

1 A. Not in that period where she was gone, no.

2 Q. And we're talking about the 30 days between
3 June 16th and July 15th.

4 A. Well, I mean, she went downtown with us a few
5 times when she reappeared.

6 Q. Other than the time that we talked about
7 previously.

8 A. Okay. Then no.

9 Q. Okay. Now, there was an incident where you had
10 some money missing and Casey was staying with you; is
11 that correct?

12 A. That's correct.

13 Q. Okay. Was it \$400?

14 A. Uh-huh.

15 Q. Is that a yes?

16 A. Yes. I'm sorry.

17 Q. Now, do you have any independent knowledge as
18 to whether Casey stole that money from you?

19 A. I have absolutely no proof. But it went
20 missing and I've known the other people that lived in
21 that house for many, many, many, many, many years and
22 they're from family.

23 Q. Okay. But as far as other than speculation,
24 you don't have any proof or knowledge --

25 A. I do not which is why --

1 Q. Let me finish.

2 A. I'm sorry.

3 Q. It's all right, it happens to everybody.

4 So other than your speculating, you don't have
5 any proof or knowledge that she took that money?

6 A. I do not, which is why I never made it a big
7 thing.

8 Q. Okay. Now, there were a couple occasions where
9 she took some checks from you?

10 A. Yes.

11 Q. Okay. How many checks do you believe it was?

12 A. I want to say it was five.

13 Q. Okay. I don't expect you to be exact, it's
14 okay.

15 A. Yeah. It was around there. It was --

16 Q. Now, you ended up prosecuting Casey for that,
17 correct?

18 A. Yes.

19 Q. Did you do that on your own or did somebody
20 suggest it to you?

21 A. No. I went straight to the police station as
22 soon as I closed out my bank account.

23 Q. Was it your intent to make sure you weren't
24 kept on the hook for that or did you really want to
25 prosecute --

1 A. No, I already talked to the bank and knew I was
2 going to get reimbursed. I had just had someone who I
3 thought was a really close friend who I gave my car to
4 for the week screw me. Beyond the fact that there was a
5 whole bunch of other really bad things happening anyway.
6 It was just, you know, to me that -- I thought we were
7 close and, I mean, if you do something bad, I think you
8 should pay the consequences or at least notify the
9 authorities and then they can decide if they should pay
10 the consequences.

11 Q. Was it your intent because you wanted to
12 prosecute her? You were angry?

13 A. No. No. No. It wasn't out of anger, it was
14 this bad thing happened and -- I wasn't 100 percent sure
15 if the bank would continue reimbursing me if I didn't
16 press charges. I wanted -- that was also a -- you know,
17 a concern was I wanted to make sure that I had my ducks
18 in a row, but it just seemed like the right thing to do.

19 Q. Okay. There came an opportunity later on after
20 she was arrested for those charges where you had a say
21 as to whether you wanted to prosecute her now or wait
22 until after she stood for the murder charge and you
23 chose to take it forward at that time?

24 A. Yes.

25 Q. What was your reasoning behind that?

1 A. My biggest reasoning was I just graduated
2 college a few years ago, I'm in the beginning part of my
3 career and if you Google my name, this thing pops up.
4 And I wanted to at least have part of it over and going
5 into the past as opposed to being in the present. So it
6 was mainly career wise.

7 Q. Were you ever informed that you wouldn't be
8 called for the criminal trial -- for the murder trial if
9 you did this?

10 A. No.

11 Q. Okay. So you knew you would be --

12 A. Yes.

13 Q. -- right back in the middle of this case?

14 A. Yeah. I just would at least have some of it
15 behind me.

16 Q. Okay. Did you ever have any conversations with
17 the prosecutors in this case as to whether you should do
18 that now or wait for later?

19 A. No, only my lawyer.

20 Q. Have you ever had any conversations with
21 Mr. George?

22 A. I have.

23 Q. Was it in reference to determining whether to
24 prosecute her now?

25 A. I don't believe so. I don't remember though.

1 Q. Were you ever made aware by any prosecutors
2 that a conviction on her record would assist them in
3 getting the death penalty should she be convicted for
4 murder?

5 A. No. I asked my lawyer that and he answered me,
6 but I did not discuss that with --

7 Q. So you were aware of that information when you
8 made your decision, is what I'm trying to ask?

9 A. Yes.

10 Q. Okay. And were you aware that Casey had
11 apologized to you?

12 A. I was aware.

13 Q. Were you made aware of it early on?

14 A. Well, I saw it on the news.

15 Q. Did you know or did you have an opportunity to
16 see when she visited -- when she had a jail visit from
17 her mother?

18 A. I saw that.

19 Q. And she apologized to you and wanted her to
20 pass along the apology?

21 A. (Nods head.)

22 Q. Is that a yes?

23 A. It is a yes. I'm sorry.

24 Q. Okay. But you still felt it was the thing to
25 do to proceed with the prosecution?

1 A. Yes. I mean, it was -- it was nice and the --
2 I -- I believed the apology and that seemed -- it seemed
3 genuine and -- and it was very nice, but someone could
4 apologize for, you know, doing something horrible and
5 they've still done something horrible. Not that I'm
6 saying -- you know, it was -- it was a very minor
7 offense, but justice is still justice. But the apology
8 was very nice.

9 Q. Okay.

10 MR. BAEZ: I'm going to take a brief recess. I
11 don't think we have much more.

12 THE WITNESS: Okay.

13 (Short recess.)

14 MR. BAEZ: We're back on the record. We're
15 going to wrap this up.

16 BY MR. BAEZ:

17 Q. I did have a question about the calendar.

18 A. Yes sir.

19 Q. Where did you do this calendar at?

20 A. Where did we do this? We did the majority of
21 it at the Barnes & Noble on -- in the children's section
22 because it was the only place that was quiet enough.
23 On -- I'm not even joking. We were going to do it in
24 the little Starbucks section but there were a million
25 people and we were like we don't want anyone to know

1 what we're talking about, so we sat on the little teeny
2 tables and the little teeny chairs. And it was the one
3 on 50 and Bumby, the Barnes & Noble there is where we
4 put this together.

5 Q. And who is "we"?

6 A. Me, Jesse Grund, Troy Brown and Ricardo
7 Morales.

8 Q. Was there anyone else?

9 A. I -- I feel like maybe Jesse -- because Jesse
10 was the organizer of doing this. He may have conferred
11 with other people, but in the very big plopping all this
12 down it was -- it was the people I just mentioned.

13 Q. And how many times have you sat down with law
14 enforcement to discuss this case?

15 A. Twice. I mean twice statement wise. I've had
16 a couple different conversations with Yuri Melich and
17 Detective Edwards.

18 Q. And these were off the record and --

19 A. Yes.

20 Q. -- not recorded?

21 A. (Nods head.)

22 Q. Okay. Were you allowed to have your lawyer
23 present?

24 A. I did not have a lawyer at that point.

25 Q. Okay. And what were these conversation about?

1 A. There was one time where they came to my
2 apartment to get the gas can. There was one point where
3 they come over after they found the body but not
4 announced it because they wanted to come and talk to a
5 lot of the people that were involved and just -- they
6 said they just wanted to, like, tell people personally
7 before it was all out in the news.

8 Q. When was this?

9 A. Right after the body was found.

10 Q. Okay. So before they announced it --

11 A. I'm pretty sure they had announced that --

12 Q. Let me finish for her.

13 A. Sorry.

14 Q. So before they announced it to the public that
15 the body was found, they came around to tell people that
16 they had found her?

17 A. I -- I think it was after it had come out on
18 the news that a body was found, and I think they came
19 around to just say that they were fairly certain it was
20 actually -- because there were a few times when they
21 thought they had found something. I don't remember the
22 exact timeline. That was a long time ago.

23 Q. Okay. And what did they tell you?

24 A. Pretty much that they were fairly certain it
25 was it. They just wanted to see how people were doing

1 and make sure people were okay and -- to that effect.

2 It was very pleasant.

3 Q. Who is "they"?

4 A. Detective Edward and Yuri Melich.

5 Q. Okay. Did they ask you any more questions
6 about what you remembered at the time?

7 A. They may have. I don't recall. I had a -- you
8 know, I had a very nice relationship with them so it
9 wasn't -- I felt very comfortable talking to them about
10 anything.

11 Q. And in these two times that you gave
12 statements, obviously -- did you speak to them before
13 you went on tape?

14 A. Briefly, I think, but not -- when I first come
15 in for this statement with Corporal Edwards I had given
16 them my phone to get the text messages. They had taken
17 that and there was some meeting going on so I was there
18 in the room by myself for quite some time because there
19 was just something that happened that -- stuff comes up.
20 I think they were brief conversations but not anything
21 extensive because we were all trying to, you know, get
22 out of there and get stuff done.

23 Q. Okay. Talk to me about the 15th of July.

24 A. Yes.

25 Q. How did that occur? You fly in from Puerto

1 Rico, correct?

2 A. Yes.

3 Q. What happens at the airport?

4 A. Casey came to pick me up in my car and then

5 I --

6 Q. Was she waiting at the gate or did she pick you
7 up at the baggage area? How did that all happen?

8 A. I feel like she was waiting at the gate, but I
9 don't know for sure. That would be a very Casey thing
10 to wait at the gate, but I don't remember.

11 Q. Okay.

12 A. That would -- that would fall in line with her
13 character.

14 Q. Do you remember the ride to drop her off at
15 Tony's house?

16 A. Just chatting, telling her about the trip,
17 hearing about her week.

18 Q. Okay. Any statements or anything from there
19 stand out to you?

20 A. I feel like that's -- and I'm not 100 percent
21 sure that this is the conversa -- I know that the
22 conversation happened but I don't know if it's exactly
23 when. I feel like that's when she had told me that she
24 was really excited that Caylee had figured out how to
25 use a phone and that she had called her.

1 Q. Okay. But you don't recall when that
2 conversation occurred?

3 A. I'm pretty sure it was in that trip, but not
4 100. Like I'm 90ish percent sure that it happened on
5 that trip.

6 Q. Okay. And then after that what happened?

7 A. I dropped her off at Tony's and then drove back
8 to pick up all the guys, because we weren't all going to
9 fit in the car with our luggage. So I drove back to the
10 airport to pick up the guys and then we drove back to
11 JP's.

12 Q. Okay. And then where did you go?

13 A. I went to the Florida Mall with JP in his car
14 because he wanted to go pick up the new iPhone that had
15 come out while we were gone. And the Florida mall is
16 fun to walk around in so I tagged along.

17 Q. Tell me about the conversation when Cindy calls
18 you. What happened --

19 A. She called me and asked me -- you know,
20 obviously stated who she was and then asked me if I had
21 seen Casey or Caylee. I was, like, well, I just saw
22 Casey like an hour and a half ago, but I haven't seen
23 Casey -- or Caylee in a while. And so she proceeded to
24 tell me that, like, she needed to find her, that she was
25 going to be in really big trouble. I believe she

1 mentioned jail for some reason. I don't recall what the
2 reasoning was why she was going to be going to jail, but
3 just seemed very important that she find her and that
4 she hadn't seen her in a long time. So that the car --
5 her car had been impounded for two weeks and that she
6 just really needed to find Casey.

7 Q. Did she say anything about the smell in the
8 car?

9 A. I don't think she said anything about the smell
10 of the car on the phone conversation. She said -- she
11 did later in the car, but not, I don't believe, over the
12 phone.

13 Q. Okay. So then she picks you up at the Florida
14 mall?

15 A. Yes.

16 Q. You get in the car and then what's the
17 conversation like as you're going to Tony's house?

18 A. Well, first it was a, it's nice to finally meet
19 you because I had yet to meet her at that point. And
20 she told me -- like actually then told me then the whole
21 story of the car impound, that was when she had told me
22 about the smell.

23 Q. What did she say in describing the smell?

24 A. She said that it smelled -- it was the most
25 horrible smell that she had ever smelled and that they

1 were terrified that it was either Casey or Caylee in the
2 car -- in the trunk until they got it open. But that
3 was -- that was her fear and she was barely controlling,
4 like, emotion in saying that. Like, that was -- you
5 could see that that was still something that she
6 remembered being upset about that that thought was in
7 her mind.

8 Q. Did she say she smelled the car or did she say
9 George smelled the car?

10 A. Both of them. I believe they were both there.

11 Q. Okay. So she's telling you this on the way to
12 Tony's house?

13 A. Yes.

14 Q. Let me ask you this: Why when she called you
15 did you not call Casey and say, hey, your mom's looking
16 for you, call her?

17 A. I knew someone who had a lot of problems and I
18 gotten pretty close with his mom, and the tone of voice
19 that she would use when she would call me just at her
20 wits end of not doing -- knowing what to do with him,
21 that was the tone of voice that I heard in her. And
22 obviously she had been dodging her mom. I knew she had
23 been dodging her mom. And the fact that she was going
24 to drive all the way out to the Florida mall -- that
25 summer gas was over \$4.00 a gallon. When I told her I

1 can be there in an hour and a half if I drove myself,
2 she immediately wanted to come get me. It seemed like a
3 really desperate mother who needed someone to help.

4 Q. Did you sense any loyalty to Casey at that
5 moment?

6 A. I did. And I actually talked to my mom the
7 entire time I was waiting. And I was like I -- I don't
8 know if I should be doing this, I just -- everything in
9 me says that this woman needs to be helped. And I
10 really hope Casey's not mad at me, I hope -- you know,
11 like, I -- I vacillated back and forth if I was actually
12 going to get in that car when she got there with my mom
13 for probably a good 45 minutes.

14 Q. Okay. So what else did she say on the way to
15 Tony's house?

16 A. Well, she told me about the car and then she
17 asked me if I knew where Casey was working. And I told
18 her that -- what I had thought, that she was working at
19 Universal as an event planner. And she said she didn't
20 even think that Casey had a job.

21 Q. Let me stop you there. How did the topic of
22 her job come up?

23 A. I don't remember. I think there was a lot of
24 between us -- like, we each knew the other person had
25 information that the other one wanted. And so there

1 were a lot of very random questions both from me and
2 from her of just I'm pretty sure you're going to know
3 the answer to this so I'm just going to ask you. I
4 don't remember how that one came up, just that it did.

5 Q. What other topics came up?

6 A. Topics of the -- her stealing money from both
7 Cindy, stealing money from her grandmother through a
8 routing check on a birthday -- or routing number on a
9 birthday check. And that was when I was like I'm
10 missing money, that's probably where that went. And she
11 was like, yeah, and it's gone.

12 Q. So she brought that up, you didn't?

13 A. She brought up the stealing and that's where I
14 sort of derived that that's probably what had happened
15 previously. Which is also what, once I got home,
16 prompted me to go check my bank account and see just to
17 be safe. And I was like I don't even know how she would
18 get it. I had completely forgotten the checkbook was in
19 the car. And just, you know, I don't know if she can
20 get it but if she can get in through routing numbers I
21 should make sure. And that was when I saw my account
22 was at zero.

23 Q. What other topics did she bring up besides the
24 stealing, the job --

25 A. The stealing, the job.

1 Q. -- and the smell of the car?

2 A. The smell of the car. I -- I don't remember
3 any other things that she specifically brought up. I
4 then at that point -- because I'm like holy crap, I
5 don't know what's going on, started asking her
6 questions. Asked about, you know, if she and George had
7 been having problems and she had said no. Asked her
8 about the living situation, that was bogus. Asked her
9 about -- there were a lot -- the -- George being sick
10 and the whole trip to Jacksonville. Just all of a
11 sudden I was thinking about all the things that didn't
12 100 percent make sense but I just let it go because she
13 was my friend. And, you know, just started, you know,
14 ticking off certain things that were big things.

15 Q. I know this question sounds a bit unusual, but
16 other than those topics did she say anything else bad
17 about Casey?

18 A. She said she didn't think she was a very good
19 mother and that, you know, she -- I'm pretty sure in
20 here I said that she wanted to -- she was close to suing
21 for custody of Caylee. Which, you know, could have been
22 true, could have just been she was upset and talking.

23 Q. This was all discussed in the 15 minute ride
24 to --

25 A. No. No. No. We were at the Florida mall and

1 we had to go all the way to Full Sail. It was a good 45
2 minute drive.

3 Q. Okay. So you get there, what happens?

4 A. I -- we had discussed what we were going to do
5 in the car just to get Casey out. And we figured it'd
6 be best if Cindy went around the corner so Casey
7 couldn't see her -- at least, you know, held back a
8 little bit. I knocked on the door, got Casey out of the
9 apartment so they could talk. So I knocked on the door,
10 they just said come in. So I opened the door and I just
11 kind of motioned her out. She's like, what? I'm like
12 just come out here.

13 And then so like she was coming out and I
14 motioned Cindy over. And I got kind of caught in the
15 corner for a while and that was really uncomfortable.
16 And it was just a lot of, you know -- because I guess
17 Casey had said she was in Jacksonville that day to her
18 mom and that was her excuse of that day of why she
19 wasn't at home. And so she -- you know, that was the
20 first thing that she accused her of of, you know, so
21 you're in Jacksonville. And then just a lot of, you
22 know, I need to see Caylee.

23 Q. That was the first topic she brought up was
24 being in Jacksonville?

25 A. I'm pretty sure that was the first thing that

1 she said. I'm not 100 percent, but I'm pretty sure that
2 was the first, like, starting out with obviously you're
3 lying to me.

4 Q. Okay. And then she said she wanted to see
5 Caylee?

6 A. She wanted to see Caylee. I don't remember the
7 exact chronology of the conversation. My biggest thing
8 was I was trying to get out of the middle of it and get
9 as far as I could with also still being close to not get
10 left there. But it was a lot of, you know, I want to
11 see Caylee, Caylee's fine, she's with the nanny. I want
12 to see Caylee. She had a picture of Casey from a party
13 and it was a party on a night where Casey had told her
14 she was working so she would babysit Caylee. And she
15 was like so you were working that night.

16 Q. She brought a picture with her on a night that
17 she was partying?

18 A. Yes.

19 Q. And Caylee was there?

20 A. No. No. No. A night where Casey was out
21 partying. It was a party that I was at as well. Cindy
22 was watching Caylee that night. Casey had told Cindy
23 that she was working so she could go to the party and
24 she would watch Caylee.

25 Q. That was the "anything but clothes" party?

1 A. Yes.

2 Q. At the "anything but clothes" party did Casey
3 share with you that she was pregnant at one time?

4 A. Yes.

5 Q. Okay. What did she say?

6 A. She said that she had had a miscarriage with a
7 guy named Brandon who was at the party and she was
8 really, really upset.

9 Q. Did you know him?

10 A. No. I'd never met him before and I've never
11 seen him. So honestly I don't remember what the guy
12 looks like.

13 Q. And she was upset that night?

14 A. She was very upset. That was the first time I
15 had ever seen her just legitimately beside herself.

16 Q. Why was she upset? Why did she share with you
17 she was upset?

18 A. All I got was that it had something to do with
19 this guy. I wasn't getting a lot of details about it,
20 but issues with this guy. And, like, he was -- he was
21 in the military and there was stuff to do with that. It
22 was all to do with this guy that she was upset.

23 Q. Okay. Did she ever mention Mark Hawkins to
24 you?

25 A. I have no idea. I kind of want to say the

1 name's familiar but I really don't know. And I couldn't
2 put any specifics into my brain so I don't want to say
3 yes.

4 Q. And you had met Tony twice, right, prior to
5 this happening? Once at the party --

6 A. I know I -- yeah, at the party I met him. He
7 came to Voyage one night. I talked to him on the phone
8 a few times. But I kind of want to say, yeah, only
9 twice. At least that's all I've mentioned in those
10 things so that was probably right.

11 Q. Let's go back to July 15th now.

12 A. Okay.

13 Q. So Cindy is confronting Casey?

14 A. Yes.

15 Q. And she shows her the picture of the night she
16 went out to a party?

17 A. (Nods head.)

18 Q. That's a yes?

19 A. Yes sir.

20 Q. What happens next?

21 A. It -- Casey was acting like a 16 year old who
22 had just gotten in trouble. She was very unresponsive.
23 Any of her responses were very cor -- curt and just
24 like, you know, I don't want to talk about the kind of a
25 thing. She, I think at that point, went to the, can we

1 just take Amy home and we can talk about this. And that
2 was pretty much then her response even through all the
3 car ride back of, you know, let's just take Amy back and
4 we'll talk about it later.

5 Q. And what happened in the car?

6 A. Cindy confronted Casey about -- I know she
7 confronted her about her leading me on with the whole
8 housing situation and a couple -- just confronted her
9 about a few things.

10 Q. What did Casey say when she confronted her
11 about the living situation?

12 A. Nothing. She sat with her arms crossed,
13 slumped in the front. She didn't even look at me. She
14 just -- she looked like a child who had gotten in
15 trouble.

16 Q. What other confrontations did Cindy have with
17 her?

18 A. I don't remember exactly. And I don't think I
19 said in my statements what it was. I know they were
20 arguing and it was mostly Cindy talking the whole way
21 back because Casey wasn't saying much of anything. But
22 I don't know if I said in here exactly what it was that
23 they talked about.

24 I know she definitely confronted me about the
25 living situation because I expected, you know, some sort

1 of a, you know, looking back; like, apologetic glance or
2 something. Some acknowledgment of, yeah, I did kind of
3 screw you over. Then nothing. Which was just -- it was
4 not any behavior I had ever seen in her before.

5 Q. Okay. Anything else stand out from that car
6 ride?

7 A. Mainly how uncomfortable it was. And how,
8 like, Cindy kept saying, like, you're -- you're taking
9 me to see Caylee and Casey would either say we'll talk
10 about it after we drop off Amy or she's fine, she's just
11 with the nanny but we don't -- we need our space, you
12 know, I don't want to disturb her. She's fine where she
13 is, I don't want to, you know, disrupt what's going on.
14 There was -- pretty much most of her responses was just
15 either later or no or we can talk about doing that
16 later.

17 Q. Do you remember exactly what she said or are
18 you pretty much --

19 A. I'm paraphrasing.

20 Q. Okay. So that's your paraphrase of what words
21 to the effect of what she said?

22 A. Yes. Yes. I could not ever try to remember
23 the exactness of words from that long ago.

24 Q. Okay. And then you were dropped off and that's
25 when you found out later from Cindy --

1 A. Yes. Cindy told me when they were dropping me
2 off that she would call me and let me know, you know,
3 like, if Caylee was okay.

4 Q. Subsequent to that, did you have any
5 conversations, text messages, phone calls, smoke
6 signals, anything from Casey?

7 A. No. I haven't -- I haven't talked to Casey
8 from that car ride to now.

9 Q. Okay. Has Casey ever told you that she harmed
10 Caylee?

11 A. No.

12 Q. Has Casey ever told you that Caylee suffered
13 some type of accident?

14 A. No.

15 Q. Has Casey ever told you there was any harm done
16 to Caylee in any way, shape or form?

17 A. No.

18 Q. Has anyone told you that Casey told them that
19 she harmed Caylee?

20 A. No.

21 Q. Has anyone ever told you that Casey told them

2 BY MR. MASON:

3 Q. I just want to get clear about the calendar.
4 Can I see the calendar?

5 A. Yes. This is July, this is June and this is
6 May.

7 Q. What I didn't really understand is how this
8 came to pass. You told us about you and the other --

9 A. We at the time -- I'm sorry.

10 Q. That's all right. Let's go. Well, how did it
11 come to pass?

12 A. We at the time had -- because we all thought
13 she had a job that she was spending time at, and so we
14 were trying to track her movements as much as we could
15 and figure out when she -- we knew she was specifically
16 in one place or when a specific thing had happened to
17 her that she had told us about or things to that effect
18 so we could, you know, accurately -- when things like
19 this happen obviously down the line, but we could put
20 together a timeline of what we knew.

21 Q. When was it that you did this calendar? What
22 was the actual dates of doing this? It wasn't
23 contemporaneous with the dates, we know that.

24 A. No. That would be pretty remarkable. I know
25 this interview was on the 23rd --

1 Q. Now, this interview you're referring to is a
2 transcript of --

3 A. Yes, with -- I'm sorry.

4 MR. KIRKCONNELL: Let her finish her answer,
5 Mr. Lawyer.

6 MR. MASON: Okay.

7 BY MR. MASON:

8 Q. You're referring to the transcript --

9 A. With --

10 Q. Of an interview between you and one of the
11 detectives?

12 A. Corporal Edwards, correct.

13 Q. Okay. Go ahead and tell me now what you talked
14 about.

15 A. That was on the 23rd of July, so it would have
16 been probably about the exact halfway point between the
17 15th and 23rd. I know this interview happened a few
18 days after we put that together, so it was probably
19 around like --

20 Q. Did Corporal Edwards or Yuri Melich, either of
21 them, or any other law enforcement person suggest to you
22 get together and construct a calendar?

23 A. No. Jesse had previously been a policeman and
24 it was his idea that we put that together.

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REDIRECT EXAMINATION

A. (Shakes head.)

Q. Is that a no?

A. No. No. Sorry. We were -- we were friends. We'd never met up until this whole thing happened, and then we hung out a little bit before but just as -- completely as friends.

A. No, just a normal friendship.
